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
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Vice Chancellor's Note

This issue is packed with insights from the vibrant academic and extracurricular activities that continue to define BUP as a hub of



BUP Film Fest 2025



BUP Film Fest is the annual flagship event of BUP Film Club, dedicated to celebrating storytelling, creativity, and cinematic excellence by bringing students, filmmakers, and film industry professionals together. The event took place on 01 and 02 February 2025. BUP Film Fest 2025 was one of the largest student-run Film Fests of Bangladesh this year, held at Bijoy Auditorium, BUP. This year's festival was dedicated to the student martyrs of BUP in the July Revolution, Mir Mugdho and Jobaer Omer Khan. The event also marked the 70th anniversary of Satyajit Roy's masterpiece Pather Panchali. Under the theme 'Stories in Every Moment,' the festival hosted six competitive segments: Short Film, Documentary, Ad Making, Script Writing, Cine Quiz, and Cosplay. It featured screening of selected films, interactive workshops, panel discussions with industry experts, and a vibrant cultural celebration. Notable guests, including renowned actors, filmmakers, industry owners and other professionals graced the festival, making it a landmark event. Some important elements were exclusively highlighted by the acclaimed filmmaker Tanim Noor on 'The Shift to Streams: Redefining Content from Cinema to OTT', where he provided thoughtful insights on how Over-the-Top (OTT) platforms are shaping the future of content creation. Additionally, a panel discussion was made in presence of renowned actress and producer Nusrat Imroz Tisha, who provided students with valuable guidance on preparing for the film and media industry. More than 450 submissions were received from at least 40 universities across six competitive categories, which was the highest in the history of film festivals at BUP. Some notable and nationally renowned filmmakers, critics, and industry leaders participated as jury and panelists. Both the workshop and panel discussions equipped the students with insights into the evolving media landscape and career opportunities. The event further strengthened BUP Film Club's reputation as one of the most active student-run film organizations in Bangladesh. BUP Film Fest 2025 successfully upheld its legacy as the biggest celebration of art and culture at BUP, providing a dynamic platform for young filmmakers and storytellers. Significant participation and engagement by different university graduates and renowned artists, film makers, professionals, artists and industry owners reaffirm the festival's role in nurturing future generations of media professionals. With plans for further expansion, including potential podcast and mini-series production, BUP Film Club aims to elevate its impact in the coming years too.

CONFERENCE / SEMINAR / WORKSHOP

Nano Medicine



A special talk on 'Nano Medicine' was held on 10 January 2025, at the Bijoy Auditorium organized by the Faculty of Medical Studies, BUP. The event delivered by one of the renowned Professors of Chemistry Professor Jamal Uddin, Department of Natural Sciences, and the Founding Director of the Centre for Nanotechnology at Coppin State University, USA, and Dean, Faculty of Medical Studies, Brigadier General Mizanur Rahman Khan, FCGP, MPhil, MPH, FRSH. Students of MPH and faculty members were also present in the lecture session.

During the session, Professor Jamal Uddin highlighted the remarkable innovations of nanotechnology over the years. He traced the origins of the field, by acknowledging the contributions of visionaries who first conceptualised the idea of nanotechnology and laid the foundation for its revolutionary advancements.

The lecture also focused on the transformative applications of nanotechnology in medicine, particularly in the emerging field of nanomedicine. Professor Jamal explained how nanoscale medicines are reshaping cancer treatment through methods like immunotherapy, offering targeted and effective solutions with minimal side effects. He also discussed the use of nanotechnology in enhancing diagnostic tools, such as MRI, to achieve higher accuracy and efficiency in medical imaging.

In addition to its medical applications, the professor touched on the broader implications of nanotechnology across various scientific domains, emphasising its transformative impact on healthcare and beyond.

The event was lively and interactive by enthusiastic participation of students, researchers, and professionals. A lively Q&A session followed, where many attendees participated in the discussions session on the future of nanomedicine and its role in addressing complex healthcare challenges.

This insightful lecture served as an eye-opener for the audience, encouraging them to explore the boundless possibilities of nanotechnology and its capacity to drive innovation in science and medicine.



University Comprehensive Academic Management (UCAM)



A workshop on the University Comprehensive Academic Management (UCAM) was successfully held from 13 to 15 January 2025 at ICT Centre Conference room of BUP. The workshop was jointly organized by the ICT Centre with Edu soft Consultant Limited, to enhance the capacity including user-friendliness of the UCAM platform and address existing operational issues. Each the sessions focused on software functionalities, troubleshooting and exploring new features to enhance academic and administrative tasks. Through this workshop, programme coordinators have become more proficient in the use of UCAM.

Nanotechnology: Small Things Matter and Have Power to Transform Energy, Health, and the Environment



On 16 January 2025, a day long lecture event was organized on titled 'Nanotechnology: Small Things Matter and Have Power to Transform Energy, Health, and the Environment'. The lecture was given by Dr. Jamal Uddin, Professor and Founding Director of the Center for Nanotechnology at Coppin State University, Baltimore, Maryland, USA. The programme was organized by the Department of Environmental Science, FST. During the session, Dr. Jamal Uddin provided an in-depth exploration and interpretation of nanotechnology, discussing its fundamental principles, unique nanoscale properties and transformative applications in energy, healthcare and environmental sustainability.



The lecture highlighted how nanotechnology is revolutionising energy, particularly using titanium dioxide nanoparticles in photovoltaics and dye-sensitized solar cells, which enhance energy efficiency due to their high surface area. In healthcare, Dr. Jamal further explained how gold nanoparticles are being utilised for biomedical imaging, targeted drug delivery, and cancer treatment. Additionally, he emphasised the role of nanotechnology in environmental protection, including pollution control, advanced waste management, and sustainable agricultural practices.

The session provided the participants with valuable insights into cutting-edge nanotechnology research, its real-world implications, and the need for ethical considerations and environmental safety as the field continues to evolve. The lecture inspired discussions on future research opportunities and interdisciplinary collaboration, encouraging further exploration of nanotechnology's potential to address global challenges.

Safe and Just Operating Space (SJOS) for Achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Bangladesh



On 05 January 2025, the Department of Environmental Science of BUP in collaboration with the University of Glasgow, hosted an impactful seminar and workshop on 'Safe and Just Operating Space (SJOS) for Achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Bangladesh.' The purpose of the seminar and workshop was to highlight the importance of creating a sustainable and equitable framework for achieving some of the related targets of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Bangladesh, especially in the context of environmental and social challenges. The event brought together leading academics, researchers and policy makers to discuss and delve deeper into the strategies and solutions that can help Bangladesh create a safe and just operating space to achieve the SDGs. The event was an opportunity for participants to engage in collaborative learning, sharing ideas, and building networks for driving change. This programme has been funded by the Glasgow Centre for International Development. Professor Md Sarwar Hossain and Mohammad Ali Nause Russel, the two eminent professionals and experts from the University of Glasgow, and former Director of the Institute of Water and Flood Management (IWFM), Prof. Dr. A.K.M. Saiful Islam were present as panel speakers in the programme. The Director General of the Governance Innovation Unit (GIU) of Bangladesh Dr. Mohammad Abdul Latif was present as the Special Guest. Among others, BUP senior officials, teachers, officers and students attended the programme.



Governance in Society, Business and Environment



The 10th International INSEARCH Conference on Governance in Society, Business and Environment was held with the theme "Governance Education Nexus for Sustainable Environment" on 23 to 24 February 2025, at Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development (BARD), Cumilla, Bangladesh. The INSEARCH conference is organized by Netinsearch International – a Network for Integrative Research in collaboration with Asian Conference on Population and Development (ACPD), China, Center for Administrative Research and Innovation (CARI) of the University of Dhaka, Stamford University Bangladesh, GAIN International of Australia, and EquJust of Tampere University in Finland. This conference has been sponsored by Sena Kalyan Sangstha (SKS) and Palli Daridro Bimochon Foundation (PDBF).

The conference covered four keynote sessions that included 'Population and Disaster Governance', 'Education, Research and Sustainable Development Goals', 'Human Rights, Peacebuilding and Challenges of Democracy' and 'Youth, Demographic Dividend and Research'. Among the keynotes speakers some international, regional and local eminent scholars, scientist, professionals and researchers were present.

In this conference, 22 students from the Department of Public Administration of BUP participated and presented six research papers under the supervision of Assistant Professor Md. Robiul Islam, Lecturer Ayesha Siddika, and Lecturer Meherin Ahmed Roza. The titles of the papers are:

Importance and Practical Aspects of Saum (Fasting) and Zakat in Human Life



On 19 March 2025, BUP Development Leaders' Club under the Department of Development Studies, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences organized a seminar titled 'Importance and Practical Aspects of Saum (Fasting) and Zakat in Human Life' at Shadhinota Auditorium for the first time in BUP. The seminar aim ed at raising awareness about the spiritual, moral, and socio-economic significance of two fundamental pillars of Islam—Saum and Zakat. The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Mohammad Monzur-E-Elahi, an esteemed Islamic scholar from National University, who offered deep insights into the inner essence of Ramadan and Zakat by highlighting how Zakat contributes to economic justice and community well-being in Bangladesh. Brigadier General Md Rabbi Ahsan, ndc, psc, Registrar, BUP, as one of the panel discussants, spoke on the health aspects of Saum, highlighting its physical and mental health benefits. Lieutenant Colonel Md. Ferdausur Rahman, PhD, AEC, Associate Professor of BUP, reflected on the relevance of these teachings in contemporary society and the importance of ethical leadership that rooted in Islamic principles. The seminar drew enthusiastic participation from students and faculty members, creating a meaningful platform for reflection, learning, and spiritual growth during the holy month of Ramadan.

VISITS

Field Visit to the Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD)





On 20 January 2025, Students of BES-23, BUP visited the Bangladesh Meteorological Department (BMD) as part of their lab course, Laboratory on Climate and Hydrological Data Management. The visit provided valuable insight into how meteorological data is collected, processed, and utilised for weather forecasting. Students had the opportunity to explore a range of advanced meteorological instruments, including hygrometer, anemometer, barometer, radar systems, automated system and so on.



A key highlight of the visit was the tour of the forecasting room, where students observed how data from satellites and weather stations was analyzed using computer models to predict weather conditions. They gained a deeper understanding of the complexities involved in weather forecasting, from data collection to its analysis and public communication.

The students also visited the seismic centre, where they were introduced to the technology used to monitor and analyse seismic activity. They learned how seismic sensors help track events, assess their potential impact, and issue early warning signals, which are crucial for earthquake preparedness.

This visit gave the students both theoretical knowledge and practical exposure to meteorology and seismic monitoring, deepening their understanding of the role that technologies and proper data management play in disaster management and climate preparedness.

Visit to Rohingya Camp in Cox's Bazar



On 30 January 2025, the Faculty of Medical Studies organized a field visit for the Master of Public Health (MPH) Batch-3 students to the Kutupalong Rohingya Refugee Camp in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The visit aimed at providing students with firsthand insights into the healthcare facilities, services, infrastructure, and living conditions of the Rohingya refugee community. The trip was led by Brigadier

General Mizanur Rahman Khan, FCGP, MPhil, MPH, FRSH, the Faculty Dean, and supported by programme coordinators and 37 MPH students.

The Rohingya refugee crisis, which escalated in 2017, has resulted in nearly one million Rohingya refugees seeking shelter in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. Approximately 80% of the refugees reside in Ukhiya Upazila, a home to the Kutupalong refugee camp, the largest refugee settlement in the world. The camp faces significant challenges, including overcrowding, limited healthcare resources, and inadequate infrastructure. The visit focused on understanding the healthcare services provided to this vulnerable population, particularly through Hope Field Hospital.

The Hope Foundation was one of the first organizations to respond to the medical needs of over one million Rohingya refugees in Cox's Bazar. Initially providing services through mobile health clinics, the foundation has since established the Hope Field Hospital for Women, the only field hospital in the region that focuses exclusively on women's health. The hospital offers 24/7 obstetric emergency care, neonatal care, and infection control and treatment, making it a great facility for addressing the unique health challenges faced by Rohingya women and children.

In addition to healthcare services, the Hope Foundation has also prioritised the physical and mental well-being of Rohingya children. In December 2021, the foundation opened a Sports Playground near the Hope Field Hospital for Women. This initiative aims to provide a safe space for children to engage in physical activities, fostering their mental and emotional health while promoting a sense of normalcy in the challenging environment of the refugee camps. Initially, the Hope Field Hospital has 40-bed facility that has been a lifeline for thousands of refugees, particularly women and children. It has treated upwards of 300 patients daily, with a significant focus on maternal health.



The Hope Foundation for Women and Children of Bangladesh was established in 1999 by Dr. Iftikher Mahmood, a Bangladeshi-American pediatrician, with the goal of serving those most in need. Bangladesh has historically faced extremely high rate of maternal, infant, and child mortality, many of which could be prevented through mass education programmes on preventative health, early intervention, and basic treatment. Dr. Mahmood envisioned the Hope Foundation to make a profound impact on the lives of vulnerable populations, particularly women and children, by providing services to those who could not otherwise afford them. The foundation initially focused on addressing maternal and child health issues in the local Bangladeshi population. However, with the arrival of nearly one million Rohingya refugees in Cox's Bazar in 2017, the foundation expanded its efforts to respond to the urgent needs of this persecuted community.

Field Trip to Sitakunda



The Department of Environmental Science organized a field trip from 06 to 10 January 2025 to Sitakunda as a part of their course- 'Field Work on Earth and Biology for Environmental Science (ENV -1208)'. A four-day field visit was organized for the students of BES-2024 (2nd semester). students of Environmental Science, they had the opportunity to observe the diverse landscape and geological features that make Sitakunda a remarkable study sites.

The journey took them through Chandranath Hill and Eco Park, where they explored the unique areas of rock and soil formation as well as the biodiversity. The steep trails provided a perfect example of soil erosion and conservative technique. They also visited the Khoiyachora Waterfall, witnessing the erosional impact of cascading water flow on the rock structure and surrounding ecosystem.

Their next destination was Mohamaya Lake, an artificial reservoir nestled amidst hills. Here they studied the importance of artificial reservoirs and the role of ecosystems. Finally, the Guliakhali Sea Beach analysed the coastal geomorphology and the interaction between land and sea.

The trip reinforced theoretical concepts learned in class, particularly the aspects of geology and biology. They observed the real-world environmental challenges which helped them to find new ideas for future research projects. The Department of Environmental Science remains committed to experiential learning, this field visit served as something vital in enhancing their understanding of geological and environmental process.



Study Tour to Cox's Bazar



The study tour was organized to provide practical learning and field data collection at the Deputy Commissioner's Office (DC) of Cox's Bazar for the students of BPA 2021 of the Department of Public Administration, Bangladesh University of Professionals (BUP). The event was held from 02 February 2025 to 06 2025. February On February 2025 a field visit

was arranged for data collection at the DC Office, Cox's Bazar, under the supervision of Assistant Professor Md. Robiul Islam, Lecturer Azmaine Faeique, and Lecturer Ayesha Siddika. Students were divided into seven teams, and each team was assigned to different departments, including Revenue, Education and ICT, Development and Human Resource Management, NGO Cell, Tourism Cell, and other offices. The officials of the DC Office guided the students thoroughly, sharing their respective functions and action plans and the ways through which they provide essential services to the people of Cox's Bazar. On 04 February 2025 another visit was made to Moheshkhali Island to oversee the socio-demographic characteristics of the local community. On 05 February 2025 the team traveled to Teknaf, zero Point, Patuartek, and Inani beach to see the sights. The day concluded with a Gala Night and closing ceremony, making it a memorable evening. Finally, on 06 February 2025 after breakfast, the whole team checked out of the hotel and began their journey back to Dhaka. The study tour gave the students invaluable insights into different practical operations of the government departments. It enhanced students' understanding of administrative functions and the ways government services are delivered to citizens. Moreover, the journey fostered teamwork, strengthened bonds, and enriched their experience beyond classroom learning. The study tour to Cox's Bazar was an unforgettable learning experience that blended education with research and exploration.

Field Visit to Oxfam



On 05 February 2025, the first-year students of the Department of Disaster Management and Resilience of Bangladesh University of Professionals, along with their batch advisor Lecturer Samantha Alam, participated in an academic visit to Oxfam Bangladesh located in the capital's Banani region as a part of their annual field trip. The objective of this field trip was for the students to gain knowledge on Oxfam's disaster response projects, their contribution to climate- based resilience and sustainable adaptation measures. There

was a seminar led by several prominent spokespeople from Oxfam, including Atwar Rahman, Head of Humanitarian Action and Disaster Resilience, Dr. Mohammad Emran Hasan, Head of Climate Justice and Natural Resource Rights, Ashish Damle, Country Director and Fadrick Suvro Nath, Local Humanitarian Partnership Specialist.



Field Visit to Shyamnagar, Shatkhira



DMR Batch-23, BUP, visited the coastal region of Shyamnagar, Satkhira from 15 February 2025 to 18 February 2025, guided by Lecturer Md. Rakibul Islam and Lecturer Kamrun Nahar Tanni. The region frequently faces adverse events such as cyclones, tidal surges, and salinity intrusion due to its geographical location. The students of the DMR-2023 batch aimed to observe and assess the region's vulnerability and identify indigenous techniques to tackle these challenges.
